REGISTRATION PROCESS

Registration for the spring games will open October 1, 2026. [Click here](#) to register your company via our RegFox page.

Your company commitment includes:

- Paying a registration fee (see Registration Fees below)
- Providing volunteers (see volunteer section for more information)
- Assigning the Company Coordinator(s) (A minimum of one person from each company is required to serve as a main point of contact.)

There is **no minimum number of employees** required to sign up, however, having access to around 20 employees ensures your company will get the most enjoyment out of the Games. Smaller companies wishing to participate, can join together with another small company to form one "Team". You will be responsible for finding your partner team and coordinating your joint participation.

REGISTRATION FEES

- Companies with 1-49 employees: \$2200

DIVISIONS

Companies will be divided into one of three divisions based on employee counts. This ensures that companies of similar size compete against each other.

Your division information will be communicated to the Company Coordinator in February.

Currently the divisions are:

Blue - smaller companies (approximately <100 Employees)

Yellow - mid-sized companies (approximately 101-600 Employees)

Red - larger companies (approximately >600 Employees)

2027 Theme

Each year we come up with a theme to give the games a little extra excitement. Past themes have included Spy Games, Games of Throws, Superstars, Camp Corporate Challenge and many, many more.

Company Volunteer Commitment

Corporate Challenge relies on over 1000 volunteers to run the Games every year and filling these positions are part of your company's commitment when signing up.

Whether it's scorekeeping at volleyball, registration at 5km Run, site-set up at Park Games or running a fun task at the Pep Rally, there are thousands of hours of volunteer positions to be filled by our companies. Plus, it's a great way to get more people from your company involved in the Games!

Volunteers do not have to be employees of your company, so family and friends can join in the fun.

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS / SHIFT LENGTH

A volunteer shift is typically 4hrs in length. There are shifts that require less time and some may be slightly longer.

Depending on your division your company volunteer requirements are as follows:

Blue – Up to **6** volunteer shifts

Yellow – Up to **8** volunteer shifts

Red - Up to **12** volunteer shifts

Please note these are the MAXIMUM numbers of volunteer shifts we will ask your company to fulfill. Final numbers will be dependent on our final Games schedules.

VOLUNTEER RULES

- Your volunteers:
 - Do NOT have to be employees of your company (friends, family are eligible)
 - MUST be at least 18 years of age
 - Are not permitted to bring along their pets or children
 - Must stay for the entire assigned shift
 - Will receive a Corporate Challenge Volunteer identifying lanyard

VOLUNTEER POINTS / PENALTIES

CHALLENGE POINTS

All teams that fulfill their volunteer shifts will be awarded 10 Challenge points.
(You will still receive your 10 points if you have a shift cancelled by us or if we do not require you to fulfill your maximum number of shifts as noted above.)

NO-SHOW PENALTIES

Companies that fail to provide as requested will:

- receive a 3 Challenge Point deduction for each volunteer shift that is not fulfilled

- be banned from the Games for the following year at the discretion of the Games Management.

Corporate Challenge reserves the right to disqualify your team from sports/events if your volunteers do not show up for shifts scheduled at the same time as your competition.

VOLUNTEER SHIFT SELECTION

Company Coordinators will be responsible for making sure your company signs up for the number of shifts required based on your division (see above).

You will have the opportunity to choose each volunteer shift on a first come-first serve basis by logging into our SignUp software.

This will be available in the spring once all of our scheduling has been completed.

Note: SignUp does not share your email address with anyone.

The deadline to pick your shifts is May 11, 2027. If you have not chosen shifts by that date, your company will be assigned shifts from those remaining.

VOLUNTEER SHIFT DUTIES

On-site training will be provided for all volunteer roles.

There will always be a supervisor or coordinator available for questions. During any volunteer shift the assigned role may vary a bit from the description or you may be reassigned if needed in a different role. The following is a brief description of some of the volunteer roles.

Games Leaders: Volunteers will be assigned to one of the Park Day stations and will be responsible for monitoring the game, managing participants, overseeing scorekeeping, and resetting the games.

Information Tent: Assists in volunteer check in, answer questions about the events, provide directions, etc.

Maintenance (Grounds/Pitch): Maintain playing surface at event (raking/sweeping, general clean up etc.)

Official: Duties vary for each event. Not all the descriptions are listed. Remember you will be trained before your shift and ask questions for clarification if you need to.

Parking & Traffic Control: Direct traffic to designated parking areas. Ensure that parking is done in an organized fashion. (Stop/Slow paddles and reflective vests provided)

Registration: Process participant's registration. This includes verifying and validating both their proof of employment and picture ID. Ensure each athlete has signed the roster. Ensure minimum and maximum roster requirements are adhered to. Other related duties as required. (Event rules should be reviewed prior to volunteering and will be available on site)

Results: Working with a results coordinator, compile, tabulate and verify results for the event. Need to have knowledge of Excel.

Runner: Transports results from the field of play to the administration area.

Scorekeeper: Under referee's direction, complete score sheets. Some venues will require scorekeepers to update bracket sheets. May include set up and/or tear down.

Set up: Assist in the set up of equipment. This may include tables, chairs, hanging posters or banners.

Table Monitors (Near Beer Pong): Volunteer role includes monitoring the game and resetting the cups as needed.

Table Monitors (Board Games): Volunteer role includes monitoring the game and resetting the games as needed.

Task Station (Spirit or Unknown): Volunteer role includes set up and tear down of the task. A task supervisor will give specifics the day of the event on how you are to instruct participants to do the task.

Tear Down: Assist in the tear down and clean up of equipment and venue. This may include tables, chairs, posters or banners.

Timer: Using stopwatches, time event activity and record/report results to the results coordinator. All timing equipment provided

Volunteer Check In: Assist in checking in volunteers, handing out lanyards and providing direction to their stations. May also include set up and/or tear down of the check in area.

Virtual Registration (Discord Events): Join voice channel on Discord and assist with checking players in and assigning to tables

Company Coordinator's Checklist

Captain's Checklist

Here is a rough outline of what a Team Captain needs to do to prepare their team for their event.

This list is not exhaustive, so please make sure you go through the specific sport rules on our webpage at www.edmontoncorporatechallenge.com.

- ☐ Know your company's division colour - It is important to know your colour as some sports have different team requirements depending on the division. [See Team Division lists.](#)
- ☐ Ensure you know the gender requirements and team size for your sport - a complete list is available here. [Team Size Summary](#)
- ☐ Familiarize yourself and your team with the rules for your specific event by reviewing the appropriate page on the website. www.edmontoncorporatechallenge.com
- ☐ Recruit team members - have a list of back-ups in case anyone drops out
- ☐ Familiarize yourself with the Identification, Eligibility and Emergency-sub (E-Sub) rule - found here. [Identification and Eligibility](#)
- ☐ Organize practice times or tryouts for your team (optional).
- ☐ Print off the event roster/waiver from your sport event page on the web site
- ☐ Ensure that all team members fill in their name on the front page (the roster) and read and sign the waiver on the last page.
- ☐ Bring the roster/waiver with you to your event - if it is a multiple day event, Corporate Challenge will keep the roster/waiver but your team must check in with ID on the subsequent days.
- ☐ **REMIND YOUR TEAM MEMBERS TO BRING ID!** This must include a picture ID proving who they are; and a Company ID proving they work for the company. Company ID can include business card, pay stub, HR letter, company credit card, ID badge, etc.
- ☐ If your event is multi-day, make sure you know when you play next. If you are unsure if you made it to the finals, check the Corporate Challenge website after the event day is over.
- ☐ Stick around for final results - your team will receive medals if placed in the top three!

Sport / Event Information

General

Calendar of Events / Play times

- The Calendar of Events ([see here](#)) provides an overview of event dates. As sport registration closes schedules with specific play times will be created and posted on each event page.
- All events take place after typical work hours on weekdays and throughout the day on weekends.

How many events do we need to enter?

- Once you have registered for the Games your company is eligible to participate in as many events as you like. There is no minimum or maximum number of events that you have to sign up for.
- Once you are registered as a company and are ready to select your sports, return to your RegFox account. You would have received an email confirmation when you registered your company. The sport selections are available in your RegFox account.

Weather Policy

- All outdoor events will take place as scheduled – RAIN OR SHINE. In the event that safety is an issue due to severe weather (high winds, lightning), Corporate Challenge Management will have the final decision as to event delays or cancellations.
- Air Quality Event Cancellation Policy
 - Edmonton Corporate Challenge will monitor the Air Quality Health Index on Environment Canada's website. We will use their scale to determine if an event needs to be cancelled.
 - 1 to 3 = 'low' health risk – ALL EVENTS PROCEED
 - 4 to 6 = 'moderate' health risk – ALL EVENTS PROCEED but if a team wishes to cancel there is no penalties assessed
 - 7 to 10 = 'high' health risk – OUTDOOR EVENTS MAY BE CANCELLED -- If the event proceeds and teams wish to cancel, no penalties will be assessed.
 - Above 10 = 'very high' health risk – ALL OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES CANCELLED
- Cancellations of events are communicated through social media, the Corporate Challenge website and emails to Company Coordinators.

Principles of Fair Play

- Edmonton Corporate Challenge reserves the right to disqualify, suspend, remove and/or otherwise sanction any manager, coach, player, spectator, team and/or company that conducts themselves in any manner contrary to the Principles of Fair Play before, during

or after an event. Your team is effectively an extension of your company/workplace. As such, all incidents will be reported to the Company Coordinator.

1. Respect the rules.
2. Respect the officials, ECC Staff and volunteers and their decisions.
3. Respect your opponents.
4. Respect your company and represent it well.
5. Maintain your self control at ALL times.

Protests

All protests regarding rules, eligibility and unsportsmanlike conduct must be brought to the attention of ECC immediately (corporatechallenge@tnthevents.ca). ECC will address the situation immediately and decide on a course of action. The decision of ECC is final regardless of whether or not the rule in question appears in the event rules. Formal complaints may also be lodged with Edmonton Corporate Challenge (by phone or email) within 24 hours of the event/incident in question. ECC Staff members will endeavour to respond to complaints as quickly as possible, particularly in instances where the resolution will directly affect upcoming games.

POINTS - Challenge, Spirit, Participation

The goal of Corporate Challenge is to encourage employee **PARTICIPATION**, increase company **SPIRIT** and, of course, **CHALLENGE** your teams to try their best!

Therefore, your team will be rewarded points in the following categories:

- **CHALLENGE**
- **SPIRIT**
- **PARTICIPATION**

The following is a breakdown of how our points and rankings work.

CHALLENGE POINTS (determines the Division Champion)

This is the one with the corporate bragging rights! Earn the most **CHALLENGE** points and your company reigns supreme as Division Champion!

Earn **CHALLENGE** points by:

- Placing in the top 6 of your division in any **CHALLENGE** event
- Placing in the top 6 in overall **SPIRIT** and/or earning 500 points minimum in **SPIRIT** challenges
- **PARTICIPATION!** Any time your team signs up and participates in a CHALLENGE or SPIRIT event you receive additional CHALLENGE points.

All **CHALLENGE** events will also award medals to participants placing in the gold, silver and bronze positions.

TEAM CANCELLATION / NO SHOW PENALTY

Cancellations AFTER the sport confirmation deadline has passed MUST be in writing emailed to the Corporate Challenge office: corporatechallenge@tntevents.ca.

If a team must cancel their participation in a sport, the penalties are as follows:

CANCELLATIONS: (Within 48 hours of your event start time)

Teams that provide written notification (by email) that they are canceling out of an event within 48 hours of the start of the event will be penalized 5 Challenge points. A company with participants who register at the event but are unable to register a minimum eligible team will be considered a cancellation and the penalty will apply.

NO SHOWS: (No notification of cancellation)

A No Show will result in a 10 Challenge point deduction. A NO SHOW is a team that has not provided any notification that their team is not participating in an event prior to start time of the event.

MISSING A MATCH:

A company missing two (2) matches throughout the tournament will be considered a Cancellation or No Show and the penalty will apply. If you think your team will DEFINITELY miss ONE match, please call the Corporate Challenge office with at least 24 hours notice so that, out of courtesy, we can inform the challenging team.

Missing a match may also happen if a player is injured and it is determined you are not eligible to continue playing. Game time is forfeit time.

SPIRIT POINTS

Winning the SPIRIT AWARD CHALLENGE is a much respected and honoured victory!

Your team earns **SPiRiT** points by participating in the events or activities labelled as **SPiRiT** (See [SPiRiT AWARD CHALLENGE](#) for all of the details)

Every team earning a minimum 500 **SPiRiT** points will earn 10 **CHALLENGE** points and any team with a minimum of 50 **SPiRiT** points will earn 5 **CHALLENGE** points.

The top 6 Teams in the Spirit Award Challenge will earn **CHALLENGE** points as follows:

- 1st Place in Spirit earns 40 **CHALLENGE** points
- 2nd Place in Spirit earns 36 **CHALLENGE** points
- 3rd Place in Spirit earns 32 **CHALLENGE** points
- 4th Place in Spirit earns 28 **CHALLENGE** points

Eligibility and Identification

All Challenge participants must:

- play for only one company
- be 18 years of age or older

For most events, participants should:

- be employed by the company at the time of the Games (full-time, part-time, contract) anywhere in Canada! (Retired and employees on leave are eligible to participate)

NOTE: You do NOT have to be employed by the company to participate in most Spirit, Fundraising, Community, or Special Event Activities.

WHO ELSE IS ELIGIBLE?

- Retired employees
- Parental and maternity leave employees

WHO IS NOT ELIGIBLE:

- professional (i.e. paid) athletes
- college or university-level athletes (playing in the most recent school year – i.e. 2026/2027 athletes)

Athletes who meet the above criteria cannot compete in their designated sport but are free to take part in any other event within Corporate Challenge.

E-SUB (Emergency Substitute)

Corporate Challenge brings employees together to build team spirit through fun events—but sometimes a team ends up one player short at the last minute. To keep teams from having to forfeit, we created the **E-SUB (Emergency Substitute) rule**, allowing one non-employee to step in and help the team compete.

How does it work?

- Each event team roster will have a space for one non-employee to step in and fill a spot to ensure you have a valid team for the duration of the sport
- If you are short an employee for a team, invite a friend or family member to fill that spot
- You can have only one E-SUB per event - but that person can play all games
- You must tell the registration volunteers you are using your E-SUB so they know that they do NOT need to verify employment
- Your E-SUB will then read and sign the waiver and fill in the highlighted line on the roster
- The only catch is that your team will be deducted one Challenge point for every event an E-SUB is used, but at least you will not be disqualified which would cost your team even more negative Challenge points
- Please note - all E-SUBs must be 18 years of age

INELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

If a player is judged to be ineligible while in “play” he/she will be immediately ejected from the event and the team will be disqualified from play in that sport for the rest of that year’s Games.

IDENTIFICATION - IN-PERSON EVENTS

At each in-person event, your participating employees must prove that they work for the company and provide proof of identity. All participants must show a photo ID along with proof of employment. This may include:

- Business Card
- HR Letter ([Click here](#) for sample HR letter)
- Pay stub

IDENTIFICATION - VIRTUAL EVENTS

At each virtual event, participating employees must identify the company they are from by changing their Discord or Zoom name to include their company name. (IE: Name, Company)

HUMAN RESOURCE LETTER

In an effort to make the registration for in-person events easier for your athletes, it is recommended that every team provide a Human Resource letter signed by your Human Resources Director/Senior Manager – ALPHABETIZED BY LAST NAME. This will accompany the roster for that event.

Communications

Blood Donor Challenge

The Blood Donor Challenge is a great team building event that does so much more - it saves lives! It's a great way to give back to the community, build a sense of teamwork within your company as well as earn some valuable points along the way.

Sign your company up and earn **CORPORATE CHALLENGE points** - here's how:
